I. CONVENE

The November 17, 2016, meeting of the Local Cal-ID RAN Board was called to order by Benjamin Polk at 2:02 p.m.

II. REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the May 26, 2016 meeting were adopted, (moved by Terry Carter and seconded by Paul Drake).

III. REPORT ON THE TECHNICAL SUBCOMMITTEE

Chair Benjamin Polk introduced Lieutenant Derek Sabatini who reported on the tasks assigned to the Technical Subcommittee on May 26, 2016.

1. Report on the Status of the LiveScan Network, Installations, and Enhancements

There were no new LiveScan installs during the months of May, June, July and August.

Livescan – Bell Police Department (*Livescan movement within their jail*) and California State University Long Beach Police Department (*New Livescan System*) have made no progress to their site.

A recent request by El Monte Police Department to move their Livescan within was received. An initial site visit provided several possibilities within their facility for a new Livescan area, which needs to be discussed by their command staff before proceeding.

Latent Workstation – On October 18, 2016, a move was completed at the Cal State University Los Angeles - Hertzberg Building. Latent equipment was moved from one office to another.

2. Report on the Status of LAFIS

The following incident occurred and caused significant downtime to our system:

From September 1, 2016 through October 31 2016, the LAFIS system was inoperable and experienced unscheduled downtime for approximately twenty three (23) hours. The primary reasons for downtime include:

- Transactions stuck in "Wait_4_Notify"

- Network Connection between Norwalk and Pasadena was disconnected by Telephone carrier.
- AFIS Tenprint – Stuck in updating Database
- AFIS Tenprint – Transactions stuck at Searching TP in ULDB

3. Mobile Identification

In May 2016, 8,302 inquiries were made of which 6,015 returned as positive identifications. In June 2016, 6,331 inquiries were made of which 4,280 returned as positive identifications. In July 2016, 6,975 inquiries were made of which 5,073 returned as positive identifications. In August 2016, 8,972 inquiries were made of which 6,375 returned as positive. In September 2016, 8,173 inquiries were made of which 5,788 returned as positive. In October 2016, 7,686 inquiries were made of which 5,313 returned as positive.

IV. **ACTION ITEMS**

A. Authorization for the Purchase PAC-50 Switches/Routers

The Network equipment that is currently installed within the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Network PAC-50 has reached its end of life status. The hardware is out of warranty and is no longer supported by the vendor. We can no longer do hardware or software upgrades. We can no longer apply critical security patches needed to secure the connections. The current network switches needed to be upgraded to prevent vulnerabilities within our network. Additionally, LACRIS anticipates MBIS to be implemented by May, 2017. MBIS is capable of moving data at much faster speeds, with larger file sizes.

The current switches are 1000 megabytes while the new switches are capable of 1 gigabyte. The approximate cost is \$900,000.

ACTION: IT WAS MOVED BY JAN POIRIER, SECONDED BY TERRY CARTER, AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED TO APPROVE 100% FUNDING TO PURCHASE PAC-50 SWITCHES/ROUTERS FOR APPROXIMATELY \$900,000.

B. Authorization to Purchase Microsoft Exchange Servers/2012 Domain Controllers

The current 2010 Microsoft Exchange Servers and 2003 Domain Controllers are being managed by our outgoing vendor 3M Cogent. This will no longer be supported once the contract with 3M Cogent ends in October of 2017. The 2003 Domain Controllers are at end of life and no longer supported. We would like to keep this separate from our current AFIS/MBIS vendor to prevent

LACRIS from having support issues in the future. Upgrading our current Exchange and Domain servers to the latest versions and separating them from our vendor will allow us to secure our network from intrusions by controlling access to our systems. The approximate cost is \$250,000.

ACTION: IT WAS MOVED BY JAN POIRIER, SECONDED BY TERRY CARTER, AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED TO APPROVE 100% FUNDING TO PURCHASE MICROSOFT EXCHANGE SERVERS/2012 DOMAIN CONTROLLERS FOR APPROXIMATELY \$250,000.
