3. MULTIMODAL BIOMETRIC IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM (MBIS) FOSTER FREEMAN

6. LA PHOTOMANAGER

Mark Dolfi reported on LA PhotoManager & Facial Recognition. Training classes for Facial Recognition are being held 1-2 times a month. Please email Mark Dolfi at madolfi@lasd.org if anyone would like to be added to his waitlist.

Mr. Dolfi introduced Deputy Blanca Rodriguez as a new instructor for Facial Recognition and Deputy Fredrick Sykes as a back-up trainer.

There has been an update to the system. Internet Explorer is no longer supported. Edge and Chrome can now be used.

California legislators proposed a full ban on facial recognition use with body worn cameras and are expected to vote on it soon.

The request for proposal is in the final stages for the Regional Photo System (RPS) and expected to be released in June/July.

7. MOBILE IDENTIFICATION

Deputy Fredrick Sykes reported on Mobile Identification. The Mobile ID contract has been awarded to DataWorks Plus for the new Mobile ID devices that include iris scans as well as fingerprints. Testing phase will begin later in the week. The new mobile devices are going to be standalone devices using the Verizon cell network for connectivity and these will be replacing the old blue check devices. We anticipate to get into the initial deployment of the first 100 devices at the end of the summer.

Martinez mentioned a mobile ID device cannot be used for hospital billing purposes, there has to be some sort of law enforcement reasoning behind the request.

A committee member mentioned at the forensics supervisor group meeting recently there was a discussion about a request that was denied through the Ran Board. Requested setting up a meeting with Lt. Sabatini regarding this.

Lt. Sabatini asked if it was regarding the fuming chambers? If so, yes we can set up a meeting regarding this or he can attend the next supervisors meeting.
