

LACRIS Terms of Use

The Los Angeles County Regional Identification System (LACRIS) is responsible for countywide account management and access to the following law enforcement applications: the Digital Mugshot System (LAPH), Mobile Identification (MID), Automated Booking System (ABS), Electronic Probable Cause Declaration (ePCD), Cal-Photo, Multimodal Biometric Identification System (MBIS), Criminal Booking System (CBS), and the Justice Identity Manager. In addition to agreeing to acceptance of LACRIS policies, Users must follow both the California Department of Justice's (DOJ) Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) laws, including but not limited to DOJ Information Bulletin 19-04-CJIS, as well as the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Security Policy Version 5.9.1 (or current amended versions).

Users are defined as authorized individuals who, in their official capacity, have been granted access to the above-listed applications for use in conducting official duties or functions, where use, searching criminal information applications, must be conducted on both a "right to know" and a "need to know" basis.

- While conducting official duties or functions, requests must include a valid reason with each search (Tag number, File Number, Case Number, etc.).
- All LACRIS systems are routinely audited for CORI compliance, CJIS security policies, and adherence to LACRIS policies.
- All LACRIS systems are available to assist in investigations. Probable cause is required to affect an arrest.

By using and accessing any of the LACRIS systems, you agree to abide by the LACRIS Terms of Use, Cal-DOJ CORI, and FBI CJIS Security policies. Any unauthorized access or misuse of these systems may result in disciplinary action ranging from access suspension to criminal prosecution, depending on the severity of the violation, as well as civil penalties.
